The first one will develop a content and curriculum library to support education in news literacy: short-term classroom activities, long-term educational group projects, and future directions of a news literacy curriculum. Also there is an idea to enrich the toolkit by incorporating elements such as transmedia literacy, fact-checking, information retrieval strategies, and a section on the circulation of scientific knowledge. The final stage is testing of curriculum in different classes with different target groups.  The second direction is centred around designing and launching an international news literacy survey to get new empirical data that helps to describe and evaluate news literacy instruction in LIS sphere. As a result we're planning to prepare of a research paper and/or report that will present our work and also generate a dataset for open use in accordance with principles of open access.
