
Roberts Academy

What is Dyslexia?

- From Greek dys (inadequate) + lexis (words).
- Dyslexia is the most common cause of reading, writing, and spelling difficulties.
- Dyslexic children and adults are fast and creative thinkers with strong reasoning abilities.
- Dyslexia can not be cured.

- Place all materials with the front cover facing outwards.
- Place similar subjects next to each other.
- Use dyslexia friendly font and pictograms.
