**IBM has recently issued its three millionth digital badge!**

What started out as a simple idea to attract talent has turned into the most influential IT credential program in the world. Now, IBM has issued its three millionth badge and hosts about 2,500 activities where badges are issued.

The idea was born in a conference room in Raleigh where a group of IBMers met for an afternoon to figure out how to attract more big data developers to IBM. Ideas were put on whiteboards and paper, and the framework for the badge program emerged.

When it was introduced in 2015, the [IBM Digital Badge Program](#) drew many skeptics who feared it would cause significant disruption. Indeed it has.

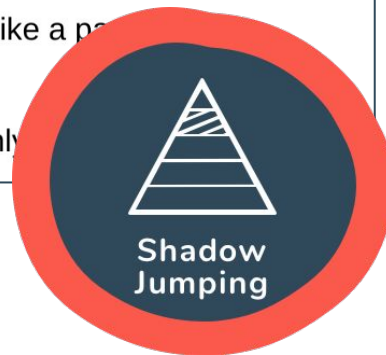


## Shadow Jumping badge

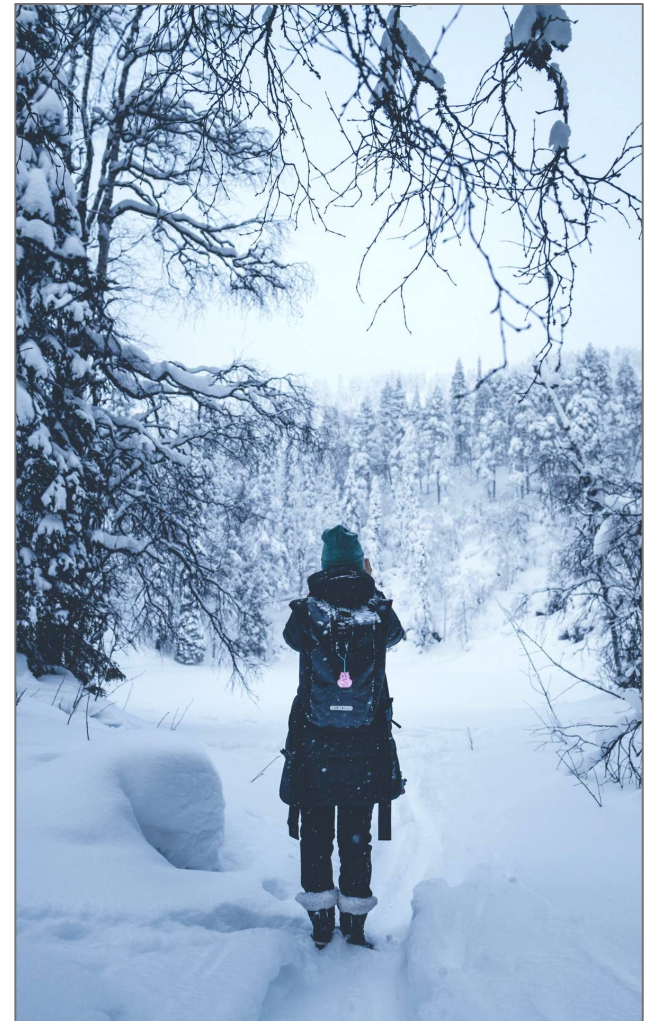

- ✓ Call them 'digital credentials' (or whatever works in your context)
- ✓ Add value to existing projects to help recipients
- ✓ Align with existing standards

# DON'T

- ✗ Just issue images (the metadata is important!)
- ✗ Create a 'badges programme' and expect anything to change
- ✗ Focus only on what works for you as the issuer



## How to make the best of your digital badge

Digital badged courses, such as those on [OpenLearn](#), have become a popular means of recognising achievement for learners, particularly in support of career development. Because they have been around for over ten years now, we know that they are used to recognise learning, to motivate, to provide a means of demonstrating professional development and to allow learners to showcase their unique strengths and interests.

But what does it mean to you, the badge earner, to have a digital badge these days?

### OpenLearn's impact

The OpenLearn website was launched in 2006 to be a platform for free learning resources in support of the Open University's (OU) commitment to its social mission. It now hosts thousands of articles, videos and several hundred courses, many of which issue digital badges.

The first UK lockdown in March 2020 saw an overnight five-fold increase in visitors to OpenLearn and by the beginning of 2022, OpenLearn celebrated the extraordinary goal of having served 100 million visitors since its launch in 2006. Now at the start of 2023, we are preparing to deliver our 250,000th digital badge.
