# 1) Welcoming of New Co-Opted Members and SIG Mentor

# 2) Previous Minutes and Acceptance of Agenda

# 3) Briefing from PU and Division

- Division H/G Update- Maggie Farrell, chair of the SIG's sponsoring section Knowledge
  Management (KM) provided a brief update of the recent meeting of Division H. Sabrina Celi
  attended a similar meeting for Division G (KM and the DH/DS SIG are in separate divisions). Some
  highlights include:
  - Information Futures (President's) Summit, September 3 October 3 in Brisbane, Australia.
     There will be no programming opportunities during the summit, but section/SIG activities may be scheduled before or after the summit. See the link above for more information.
  - KM is still determining if/how they plan to participate in the summit. Their next meeting is planned for March, where they'll discuss this, as well as a possible mid-year event. KM has committed their full support to the SIG's midyear event.
  - Re: unit reviews, IFLA is working on an outline for reviews. This will impact the SIG, as we are due for a review and need to prepare to position ourselves to apply to be a section.
  - Re: action plans, Sabrina explained that the SIG's action plan is due to be updated and approved on March 15. It will then be posted on Basecamp.

#### 4) News Media Conference

- Long Xiao provided an update on the upcoming <u>2024 IFLA International News Media conference</u>.
   Partners include the IFLA News Media Section, IFLA DH/DS SIG, IFLA Preservation and Conservation Section, IFLA Information Literacy Section and the Royal Danish Library.
  - The conference will take place May 29-31, 2024 at Det Kongelige Bibliotek (Royal Danish Library) in Aarhus University in Aarhus, Denmark.
  - There are nine members on the committee including two reps from the DH/DS SIG, Long Xiao and Marcin Werla.
  - Nineteen abstracts were submitted to the call for papers. Acceptances will be sent out March 1, and registration opens in March. There are a limited number of spots available, only 50, so register quickly if you'd like to attend.

## 5) Mid-term event

- Sabrina Celi provided in update on the status of the SIG's midterm event. The KM and IT sections and AI SIG are confirmed partners for the event. We are establishing an official planning committee to determine the scope and manage the project.
- Description of the project: The session(s), likely virtual, will feature speakers at the intersection of DH/DS and AI research. These researchers/scholars/experts will:
  - Provide insight into a specific critical element of the global DH/DS field, in the application of Al/Machine Learning that can be used to transform research methods.
  - Present their projects and share experiences of developing and acquiring skills for DH/DS projects.
  - o Contribute to understanding of tools, systems and languages.
  - Provide examples in analytics, data/text mining, knowledge discovery processes, reproducibility of models, experiences of inclusiveness.
  - Provide expertise in usability, interoperability, accessibility, preservation and conversation.

- o Discuss fair, ethical and legal use of information in digital contexts, not exclusively DH/DS.
- This event is intended for a diverse and wide audience involved in managing, curating and
  preserving digital materials, including digital repository managers, content curators, software
  developers, scholars and library administrators; as well as cultural heritage institutions, software
  companies, and other organizations working with digital materials.
- Suggested formats for the event, to be determined by the planning committee, include a webinar
  or a podcast.
- KM, the IT section and the AI SIG will be sending a list of volunteers for the planning committee.
   Our SIG is asking for members as well. Interested parties should contact <u>Sabrina Celi</u>, <u>Jenny Mackiewicz</u> and <u>Long Xiao</u>. Information about volunteering will also be posted on the DH/DS Basecamp. Please express your interest by **Wednesday**, **March 6**.
- Additional comments from attendees include:
  - John Wang, a SIG Standing Committee member, offered to serve on the planning committee.
  - Corey Lampert, chair of the IT section, suggested the committee remain flexible in terms
    of format, and perhaps wait until the proposals are received before confirming. The IT
    section has hosted a series of Symposiums around the globe, with a high level of
    participation and interested speakers.
  - o Anna Au offered her expertise on recording and producing podcasts.

# 6) General business/Others

- The SIG is recruiting for several planning committees and subcommittees to help manage SIG
  activities. It is essential that the responsibilities and duties of the SIG are disbursed amongst the
  members of the Standing Committee and the volunteers, to maintain momentum while we work
  toward becoming a section. Committees include:
  - Midterm Event Planning Committee- Assist in planning and executing the midterm event, an online webinar in partnership with the KM Section, IT Section and AI SIG. Members will recruit speakers, determine the format, recruit a facilitator, create a marketing plan, etc, and execute the event.
  - Website and Information Subcommittee- This subcommittee will help create and manage the web and social media presence of the SIG.
  - SIG Creative Content and Publications Subcommittee- This subcommittee will work with
    the Website and Information subcommittee on content creation for the SIG. This includes
    the suggested series of interviews with DH/DS professionals in the public and private
    sector. Members will create a plan for the SIG's content over the next six months and
    assist in writing and publishing that content.
