# 4. Debrief report on MetLib Conference 2023 in Buenos Aires

Pablo presented the report of the survey re the conference, that is also published on basecamp. 41 responses were received. Above 95% generally expressed high or very high satisfaction with the conference. More than 80% considered that it was useful for their work. They mainly highlighted the exchange and the opportunity to learn about diverse experiences and points of view.

Of the organization of the event, the most valued were the location of the event, the translations, and the tango gala. More than 95% were satisfied with the contents of the

sessions. Of the contents of the conference, the most valued were the speakers, the thematic panels, and visits to libraries.

Pablo resumed that it was great to host colleagues from around the world. The scholarships for colleagues from Latin America helped to have a conference that was more inclusive and diverse

Carolyn added that the bilingual part of the conference worked very well. She thanked Pablo and the conference team for this great conference and their efforts.

The unconferences ended up being in Spanish. They were informal and successful.

Carme asked about the fees for the conference: Pablo answered that there has been a reduced fee for participants of the developing countries.

#### 5. Interim conference in Barcelona 2024, 6-10th October 2024

Carolyn welcomed the director of the regional libraries of the region of Barcelona, Ferran Burguillos

Carme reported that they have held a couple of meetings with the Ministry of Culture, the Barcelona Provincial Council and FESABID (Spanish federation of library associations) to agree on the calendar of the midterm/congress of the PL and MetLib sections.

They have also agreed with Cerlalc that they will attend the conference and they organize the simultaneous sessions that they require. Jeimy Hernández, the managing director of Cerlalc, will talk with IFLA-LAC.

The agenda will take place from October 6 to 10. 2024 in Barcelona, as follows (subject to possible changes):

For PLS/MetLib/Buildings sections:

Sunday afternoon, October 6: Section business meetings Monday 7: Libraries and Democracy Conference (provisional title). Tuesday 8: Workshops Section Wednesday the 9th and Thursday the 10th: Visits to the library In addition, there will be a reception and dinner for the speakers.

For the collections and rare books section:

Monday, October 7: Section Meeting (morning and afternoon) Tuesday 8: Symposium Wednesday the 9th and Thursday the 10th: Visits to the library

Different and new of the conference: It will be a joined meeting of the MetLib Section, the Public Libraries Section, the Building and Equipment section, and Rare Books Section. A holistic conference for all participants is the plan.

Ferran added that they want to promote the participation of colleagues from Latin American and Caribbean Countries, not only Spanish speaking. They are in contact with the Latin American Section of IFLA. 400 people are expected. Carolyn added that the PLOTY will be presented at the conference. The sponsor changed to Baker & Taylor.
