

Advisory Committee on Standards Review Groups Action Plan Template – ISBD Review Group

Review Group Action Plans provide both a means of structuring and monitoring their own work, but also a means for others (Advisory Committee on Standards) to understand and engage with it.

Each Review Group has Terms of Reference which outline their purpose. Review Groups carry out a range of different forms of action, varying both with other types of committees, and between themselves. In addition to self-contained projects such as the development and ongoing revision and maintenance of standards, or the organisation of webinars, all have a role in monitoring relevant events in the wider world, engaging in ongoing processes run by others.

Importantly, there is also their role in responding to requests for advice and reflection from the Advisory Committee on Standards. These cannot necessarily be planned for, but the Action Plan should leave capacity to react to such requests, as well as to emerging issues.

0. CONTEXT
